FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARY

House Bill 133 would authorize the unincorporated areas of Graham County to levy an additional 3% room occupancy tax. At least two-thirds of the proceeds would have to be used for tourism promotion and the remainder for tourism-related expenditures.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Graham County currently levies a 3% occupancy tax for both the incorporated and unincorporated areas in the county. Fiscal Research used occupancy tax collections by Graham County’s Tourism Development Authority and municipalities in Fiscal Year 2020-21 and adjusted it for actual and forecasted changes in the leisure and hospitality industry to determine the fiscal impact. It is estimated that the Authority would collect an additional \$362,000 in Fiscal Year 2023-24 room occupancy tax collections at an additional 3% rate.
